

The procedure for tattooing (permanent makeup) of eyebrows, eyes or lips has absolute and relative contraindications, which can cause side effects.

ABSOLUTE CONTRAINDICATIONS

Permanent makeup procedure is strictly prohibited.

Cancer, not in remission;

Problems with blood clotting:

Caused by the fact that there is no normal vascular occlusion when the blood vessels are damaged.

Somatic (medical) pathologies:

Somatic (medical) pathologies can have different forms: the most common are anorexia, depressive, conversion, sexual disorders and asthenic syndrome.

Acute inflammatory processes;

HIV, AIDS;

Hypertension:

Characterized by excessive elevation of blood pressure.

Allergy to anesthetics;

Skin diseases in the acute phase;

Pregnancy;

Taking blood thinners:

It is a known fact that in order to reduce the risk of blood clots and prevent strokes and heart attacks some patients are prescribed blood thinners.

Keloid scars:

Proliferation of connective tissue that occurs at the site of injury.

Diabetes mellitus, not type 2;

Alcohol and drug intoxication;

Scleroderma;

Mental illness, epilepsy:

Epilepsy is a chronic non-communicable brain disease that can affect people of any age.

RELATIVE CONTRAINDICATIONS

Lactation period;

Menstruation;

Taking antibiotics;

Under age;

Inflammation and pustules in the
area of planned treatment;

The presence of warts or moles in the
area of planned treatment;

In case of herpes or allergy, permanent makeup procedure can be done if a patient follows all the recommendations of their doctor/PCP and makeup professional.

**Disturbance of the general sense of well-being:
stress, sleepless night, rhinitis and acute
respiratory infection.**

It is advisable not to conceal any contraindications from the makeup professional; otherwise, serious complications may arise during or after the procedure.
